





Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

The three Rs: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle are a simple, yet incredibly effective strategy used in counteracting the effects on the environment from our energy consumption, the materials we use, and our sustainability.

At Samuel Grant Group we take action to help minimise our impact on the future of our planet.

Reduce

We help clients minimise packaging use through solutions like the Samson Nano, an automated pallet wrapper that reduces film waste while maintaining secure pallet wraps. Combined with our packaging audits, which analyse production and distribution processes, we identify opportunities to lower packaging volume and reduce the use of virgin materials.

Reuse

Our bespoke plastic pallets help clients close the loop in packaging by encouraging reuse, saving both money and waste. We've also designed a multidrop plywood case for large OEMs, allowing engineers to swap components efficiently, with replaceable inserts to extend the products' lifespan.

Recycle

We prioritise using recycled content in our products and work to maximise recycling across operations. Our sister company, Marmax Recycled Products, has saved a billion HDPE bottles from landfill by transforming them into sustainable furniture and outdoor goods. Additionally, when delivering a Samson Nano machine, we collect clients' old machines for recycling through the Recycling Lives scheme.












Ethics








Case Study: Reducing Single-Use Plastic in Logistics

Samson Pallet Stability implemented the Samson Nano pallet wrapping system to dramatically reduce consumption of single-use plastics. The goal: maintain load security while cutting waste and CO₂ emissions.
